At Ronald McDonald House Charities of Southern California (RMHCSC) and Camp Ronald McDonald for Good Times our commitment to protecting the health and well-being of the vulnerable population of children we serve, their families, staff, volunteers and communities is always our top priority.

Camp provides vital emotional, social, medical support and resources to youth and families with vulnerable children, many of whom are immunocompromised while staying in congregate cabins and shared activity spaces.

Since the beginning of the pandemic, Camp has consulted with the Camp Medical Advisory Committee of oncology physicians and nurses, State & County Health Departments, the American Camp Association, Children's Oncology Camping Association, and the Center for Disease Control with a focus on delivering our mission in the safest way possible. This means following the known measures that help prevent the spread of the coronavirus, including vaccinations and boosters, testing, masks and face coverings, stringent cleaning and disinfection and social distancing guidelines.

Our pledge at Camp Ronald McDonald for Good Times is to support children and families and to ensure that they are kept safe in Camp program spaces. When families are not able to participate in-person, alternative virtual support and activities are offered, when possible.

Since the beginning of the pandemic, RMHCSC and Camp Ronald McDonald for Good Times continue to serve children and their families from Southern California and beyond. We will continue to navigate this challenging time together as a community to deliver mission in the safest way possible.
