The Meals of Love Program is back and we are accepting reservations for groups to come in and cook for the families. 

#### Your Support Makes a Difference

So far, in 2022, your donations have made it possible for 589 families to stay at the Inland Empire Ronald McDonald House. This number is anticipated to reach 700 families by the end of the year. The actual cost pernight for a family to stay at IERMH is \$150.00. The Inland Empire house has 54 rooms and throughout 2022 the average occupancy rate has been a steady 65%. A donation of recommended donation per night is suggested per family. It is understood that most families are unable to make a contribution of any amount and that is where you come in. The Inland Empire Ronald McDonald House operates successfully because of your donations. Your support keeps the lights on and makes the house a home for the families that stay.

We are grateful for all donations and our hope is that you use the envelope attached to this new sletter to help provide comfort to the families that stay at IERMH. A one-time donation will help fund a family into the New Year. A commitment to become a monthly donor will help fund several families throughout 2023. # **Homecoming!**



Leslie Vargas and her family have dealt with challenging medical issues for most of Leslie's 11 years of life. It took a few years of traveling from their homein Thermal, California, to see different doctors before a repeat visit to Loma Linda Children's Hospital finally identified a diagnosis. Leslie was diagnosed with a brain tumor which was causing her to have headaches and

seizures. Leslie's parents agreed that the 8 hour surgery recommended by doctors would be the best option for their

daughter.

Their family was filled with worry and the 80 mile drive between Thermaland Loma Linda was causing more stress for the family. Lydia Vargas, Leslie's mom, didn't have reliable transportation to make the trip to Loma Linda. She didn't know how she as going to manage the time and cost for her family. She expressed her concerns to a social worker at the hospital and that is when she learned about the Inland Empire Ronald McDonald House.

"Staying at the Ronald McDonald House was a big relief for all of us financially and emotionally. I am grateful for the house," Lydia Vargas said when she shared her experience at a recent IERMH Board Meeting. Leslie and her mommoved into IERMH on August 15, 2022. Her father and the rest of the family made visits to the house during Leslie's 49 day stay.



Family Support Services (FSS) provides emotional support, education and resources to the families and staff of the Ronald McDonald House. Individuals and entire families are served in the privacy of the FSS offices, around the House or wherever a person feels most comfortable. FSS plans and manages House therapeutic activities such as Fun Clubs, holiday activities, and special events that provide a caring environment for all.

"At RMH, I get to build relationships on a personal level because I interact with clients, not only in session, but as they cook dinner for their families, as they are running back and forth from the hospital, in the playroom, etc. One of the best parts of my day is doing Fun Clubs and getting to interact with multiple families all at once.
